- Restoring parks and playfields impacted by tornadoes in the Town of Monson
- Constructing a children's nature play area at the Mass. Audubon's <u>Broad Meadow Brook Conservation</u> <u>Center and Wildlife Sanctuary</u> in Worcester

"In such a difficult economic time, it's more important than ever for our businesses to support families and children in need of help," said Mayor Thomas M. Menino of Boston. "Blue Cross is playing a leadership role in improving the lives of families in need and creating a safe environment for our kids. Service Day is a testament to their dedication to the community. Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts will remain open on September 20 in a limited capacity. Dedicated call center associates, essential to supporting BCBSMA members, will continue to work throughout the day, operating in shifts to ensure they can join in Service Day activities. During their volunteer shifts, these associates will sort items collected in office donation drives and assemble educational and welcome baby kits for Cradles to Crayons. The kits will be delivered to children and parents in need across Massachusetts.
