Flu vaccines are widely available and can be administered by your doctor, at your neighborhood pharmacy, urgent care clinic or health center. The national vaccine finder, <u>https://www.vaccines.gov/find-vaccines/</u> is an easy-to-use tool to locate a vaccine provider. The flu vaccine is free for most people with health insurance. Many community health centers, and other non-profit organizations offer free flu clinics for those without insurance.

To educate members and the community about the safety and effectiveness of the flu vaccine and encourage vaccination, Blue Cross has launched a multi-channel media campaign that includes emails to members and posts on its <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Twitter</u> channels.
